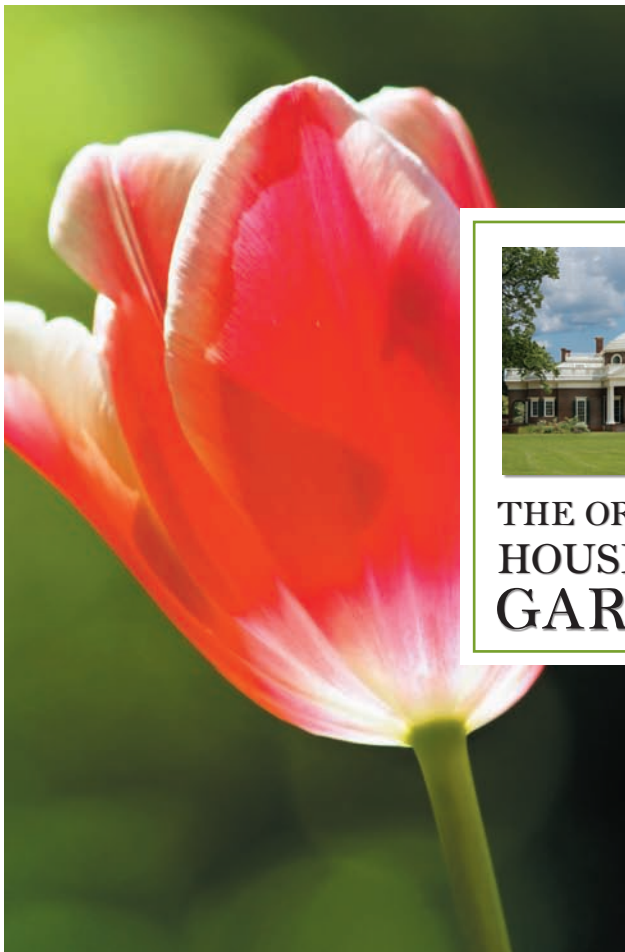
20th Annual Writer's Eye Contest Ceremony

The University of Virginia Art Museum has done it again. After carefully sorting through 1256 entries from students grades 3-12, University students, and adults, winners have been chosen and prizes are ready to be dealt out for displays of competent and creative writing. The number of entries this year marked the largest number of entries ever for the competition. Organized by the docents of the UVA Art Museum, this year's competition featured works on view in the museum's galleries in the special exhibition "Complicit! Contemporary

American Art and Mass Culture." The submitted work, which consisted of prose and poetry inspired by the artwork in the museum, was judged (on the high school and University/adult levels) by Matthew F. Jones in prose and Lisa Spaar in poetry. Each are acclaimed authors who have published various books. Those judged as the winners received prizes that included cash awards, museum memberships, and gift certificates to area businesses.

Wine Trail Adds Wineries

The Monticello Wine Trail, the group of 22 wineries in the area run by the Jefferson Grape Grower's Society, decided to extend its membership to three additional wineries. Those selected are Prince Michel Vineyard & Winery, Christensen Hill Winery, and the soon-to-be completed Acorn Hill Winery. These wineries are all located in Madison County, with the trail already including wineries in Albemarle, Orange, Nelson, and Greene counties. They reflect the character and lineage of the Trail's existing vineyards and uphold the traditions of winemaking that are so important to the area. The wines produced by these vineyards are also grown from the same soil, topography, and climate as the rest of the area, which is important in determining the character of the grapes grown there.
